- Attendance has been relatively flat
- Is this satisfactory?

- Is there something big, or fundamental that we can change?
- Do we want to include more compliance safety tracks?

Results of Member Survey(s)

- Membership Directory Questionnaire (~30% response rate)
- Do you favor putting Membership Survey on-line?
- Response: Yes 238, No 18, No opinion 8
- Clear majority (164 out of 246) want both on-line and paper directories available to members only. Note: There were numerous constructive suggestions on how to format and sort information.
- Those **NOT** wanting information published should indicate such on the Membership Renewal form (provision to be provided on form).
- Membership Survey (Wants and Needs ~20% response rate)
- Broad range of responses, requests, recommendations, volunteer requests, etc., from several hundred members are being reviewed and assessed by SSS Executive Council for consideration and implementation. Feedback will be provided.
